100. Buckinghamshire Councilors' Reports

Apologies received from Cllr Fealey.

Cllr Cornell gave an oral report providing an update on the work that has been completed by Buckinghamshire Council including assisting residents at Church Lane with drainage issues, gully work at Tudor Barn, the gullies at Main Street are to be repaired. Some potholes have been repaired but there are more to complete which are in the system.

Buckinghamshire Council will be delivering their largest Highways capital project including carriageway schemes, traffic signals, maintenance of bridges, improving drainage and road safety improvements.

In light of the recent extremely wet winters, an additional £500,000 is to be invested in extra drain and ditch clearance in addition to the commitment to cleanse every gully in Buckinghamshire to facilitate the easy flow of water.

Transport arrangements are underway for the new school term and a major re tendering exercise is taking place over the summer

Buckinghamshire Council has launched the 'Ask Angela' scheme, which local pubs are participating in.

Buckinghamshire Council is looking for foster carers and anybody interested is urged to visit Buckinghamshire Council's website for further information.

Questions from the Parish Council

It was questioned how much of the money that has been spent by BC has been in the north of the county, it appears from publicity that it is being spent in the south of the county. There are areas in Tingewick that have been awaiting repairs for many months.

Concern raised by the Parish Council about the road diversions that are being imposed at short notice and there is often no clear diversion route.

Once work has been completed is often the case that the old diversion signs are not being removed by the contractor.

Concern raised that an issue that was dangerous was reported via Fix My Street, it was considered not to be dangerous by FMS, when escalated by the Parish Council, it was resolved.

It was asked that it be taken back to Buckinghamshire Council that it is felt that the charging policy at the tip is encouraging fly tipping

Footpaths, Footways, Highways and Street Furniture-Cllr Maxwell

Street Furniture - Salt bin has been damaged at top of Cross Lane. It was agreed that we would purchase another.

Stowe View, Buckingham Street and Main Street are due to have various works completed in August.

Pond and Special Projects-Cllr Newman

Cllr Newman is holding a sum in the region of £2,000 that was raised towards the £45,000 that was required for the pond repair work. We are unable to undertake the substantial work that was envisaged.

It was agreed that the Parish Council will liaise with the local schools to see if they would like to engage in a project to revitalise the pond.

Recreation Ground Play Area and School Playground/IT - Cllr Holmes

Devolved Powers (Grasscutting)-Cllr Rennie

Pond cutting is on the cutting schedule, but it is not being undertaken as it is currently being cut by the Parish Council's grounds maintenance.

We have been notified by BC that they have adopted further areas at the Bovis Estate and as such it now falls under the Parish Council's devolved duties. We have only been given an additional £7.18 for the year to undertake this. It was agreed that we will make enquiries as to whether we can substitute this additional work for the pond that was in the initial devolved schedule.

104 The Royal Oak/Red Lion – Potential Community Assets

It was noted that Finmere has identified the Red Lion as a community asset.

This is not something that the Parish Council will pursue with The Royal Oak.

105 Fete Accounts

Cllr Hornsey provided an oral report as to the income received and the expenditure incurred. A profit in the region of £1,000 was made.

It is noted that the Fete's primary aim is not to make a large profit and that there was a great deal of hard work undertaken by the Fete Committee to ensure that the event was an enjoyable village event.

The committee will consider how to increase income for next year's Fete, including sponsorship.

106 Tree Works

Cllr Lightfoot has received the following costings for tree work.

£575 to cut the hedge to the rear of the Cemetery - Agreed

£575 to top the Irish Yews at the Cemetery - Agreed

£1,250 to pollard the Ash tree at the Recreation Field. It was noted that the tree can be cut down or pollarded. It was agreed that the tree be pollarded, however the cost quoted was considered excessive. Cllr Lightfoot to make further enquiries as to costs.

Cllr Lightfoot

£200 to cut the hedge at the rear of the pond. Cllr Newman to make enquiries as to whether the donors to the pond fund (as above at Item 103) will agree to the money collected being used towards this.

A resident has sought permission to cut the rear of the hedge by the pond that backs onto their garden which has been given.

£375.00 to reduce the Cherry Tree - Agreed

£375.00 to remove the failed Hawthorn on the Triangle - Agreed.

A price will be obtained to replace the tree with similar - Double Pink May Hawthorn

107 Correspondence

- a. Resident Speeding out of the village up Water Stratford Road. The Parish Council is sympathetic but has no powers to enforce or monitor speeding. This is a police matter.
- Resident Gorrell Lane brambles require cutting. The Parish Council will arrange for the brambles to be cut back.
 Action: Cllr Rennie
 - There is a dead badger in Gorrell Lane. This has already been reported to Buckinghamshire Council.
 - Concern raised at damage to footpath due to site traffic at Field Close, Cllr Maxwell will report the footpath via Fix my Street.

108 Recreation Ground Report/Development

- a. An estimate has been received from our contractor to demolish the remaining structure, removal of debris, leaving the existing ground floor slab in place, bringing in topsoil for levelling off the area and seeding with grass seed in the sum of £7,148.32 plus VAT £1,429.66. This sum will be paid from the s106 monies that are being held by Buckinghamshire Council, however, will require initial payment by the Parish Council until funds are released. It was proposed that the estimate be accepted.
